

From The President



Just a few days from now we will begin our remembrance and celebration of what Andreas J. Köstenberger and Justin Taylor call "the most important week of the most important person who ever lived." (*The Final Days of Jesus*, Crossway, 2014) Passion Week, also called Holy Week, begins with shouts of "Hosanna!" and concludes with the great affirmation, "He is risen! He is risen indeed!"

It is axiomatic to say that the resurrection is central to our faith. Paul certainly didn't mince words on that point. "And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith" (1 Cor 15:14) "And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins." (1 Cor 15:17). Futile faith and useless preaching—that's strong language.

I recently came across a quote that captures the significance and power of the resurrection in our lives. These words were spoken at the memorial service for Supreme Court Justice Lewis F. Powell Jr. by James C. Goodloe IV, the pastor of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church in Richmond, VA.

We rejoice in Christ's resurrection as the promise of our own, as the promise of resurrection of those whom we love, and as the promise of the resurrection of Justice Powell. Death pretends to be Lord over us. It's not. God alone is the Lord over our lives. Death tries to have the last word about who we are. It doesn't. God has plans for our lives that even death cannot destroy. Death struts its seeming great power, but its power is broken. To Christ belongs the victory. Though death will lay claim to all of us, it will not hold us all, for we do not belong to death. We belong to God in life, we belong to God in death, and we continue to belong to God in that new life on the other side of death.

This week, "the most important week of the most important person who ever lived," re-centers our lives on the most important truths ever heard and believed,



"I have been with KAA since the beginning and I am very thankful that God has allowed me the honor and privilege of working alongside some of the greatest people in the world," Morgan said.

An article on "War" for the *Understand the Faith Study Bible* (2015). Drs. Noelliste and Chung contributed as well.


