Tour of Israel

The first trip will be an eleven day tour in January and will be led by world-class tour company, Morning Star Tours. Along with a private guide, you will be traveling with and learning from Denver Seminary President Dr. Mark Young and Dr. Joseph Dodson, Associate Professor of New Testament. Trip participants will stay in some of the best hotels in Israel.

New Certificate Program in Spiritual Direction



The Certificate in Spiritual Direction is designed for students who are seeking training and credentialing for the ministry of Spiritual Direction. Students will receive a foundation in the history and theology of spiritual direction, as well as the requisite practical training to establish and implement a ministry of Spiritual Direction.

Beginning in September and running through August, the Certificate in Spiritual Direction consists of four 5-day intensive courses on the campus of Denver Seminary. These courses are Masters level and are taught by Denver Seminary Faculty and Adjunct Faculty. Between each course, students engage in reading and assignments pertaining to their learnings, receive Spiritual Direction themselves, practice offering Spiritual Direction to others, and receive Supervision from an experienced Spiritual Director.
