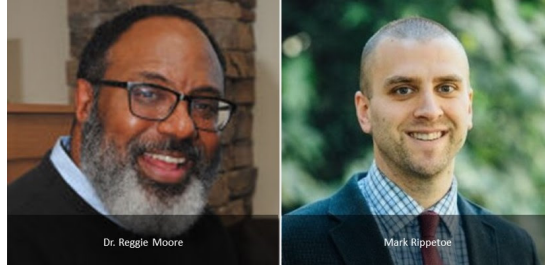


Greetings! If you are like most of our Counseling Division graduates, you are already highly engaged in the counseling field, serving clients and other populations in wonderful and transformational ways.

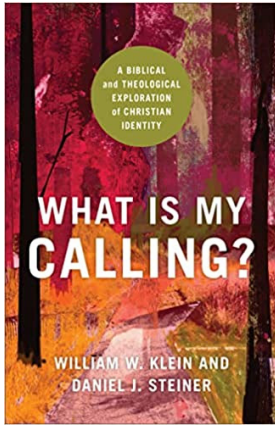

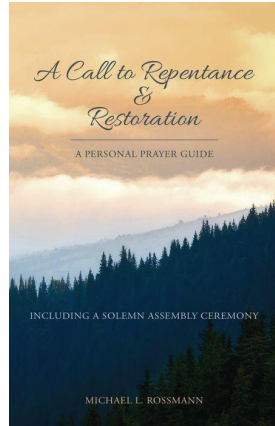
**What is My Calling?

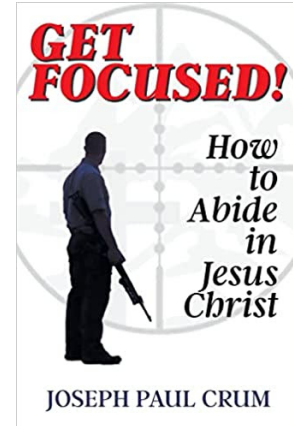


**A Call to Repentance &
