
- The Work of the Holy Spirit in Clinical Practice and Research led by Dr. Siang Yang

#### **Training and Mentoring Welcomes New Mentoring Professor**



Teri Elliott-Hart (Assistant Professor of Training and Mentoring) is the newest member of the TM Curriculum teaching team, having recently relocated from Boston, MA. She has earned degrees from Boston College (Ph.D. Education and Theology), Harvard University (M.Ed. Teaching and Curriculum) and studied education as an undergraduate at Brown University.

Current research interests include adult learning theory, consumer culture and the contemporary church, and youth leadership development in multi-cultural contexts. Professionally, her love of teaching and learning has been expressed in movement from immersive ministry experiences, such as community development and teaching immigrant high schoolers, to reflection on these practices through research. Most recently she has worked in Mentored Field Education at Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary and at a high school in Boston developing leaders for biblical social justice initiatives. She loves being a student and being a teacher and considers a posture of life-long learning to be essential for flourishing. The Training and Mentoring Curriculum, with a focus on students setting formation goals in the midst of their studies, reflects Dr. Elliott-Hart's personal values around developing whole-life spirituality to make room for the movement of God's spirit in all domains of our experience. For her, this includes finding God in parenting her three young adult children, enjoying nature, studying, and reading science fiction.



Did you know that Denver Seminary's Soul Care Initiative offers a one-year training in Spiritual Direction?

This Certificate in Spiritual Direction consists of quarterly seminary-level intensive classes, taught by Denver Seminary faculty and adjunct faculty. Students are introduced to theology which undergirds Spiritual Direction, historical and ecumenical teachings on spiritual formation and soul care, the interplay of psychological understanding and Spiritual Direction, practices for the spiritual journey, skills necessary for the Spiritual Director, and much more! Each student continues to hone their attentiveness to the Holy Spirit and their personal skill through small practicum groups, which meet a couple times a month and are led by a trained Spiritual Direction Supervisor. This program can be completed primarily remotely, with the exception of required in-person attendance at the first two intensive classes.






## The Hope of the Gospel Theological Education & the Next Evangelicalism






## Christian Apologetics A Comprehensive Case for Biblical Faith 2nd Edition


