

PhD in Counseling Education and Supervision

Did you know that in August we started our second cohort for the PhD program in Counseling Education and Supervision? We now have 20 people in this doctorate program and are committed to growing it going forward. It is a four-year, relational, cohort-based, online doctoral degree program.

As the number of Americans with mental health conditions increases, the demand for professional counselors who have the specialized education and training to care for them is increasing. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of substance abuse, behavioral disorder, and mental health counselors is projected to grow 25% from 2019 to 2029—much faster than many other career fields. This means the industry needs more "training of the trainers."



Denver Seminary has stepped into this gap to prepare counselor educators and supervisors who can serve in other educational institutions, develop new programs in counseling, increase the number of trained counselors, and, ultimately, serve significantly more clients in need.




Jesus and the Gospels, Third Edition


