Should a Christian Be an Environmentalist?



The briefest perusal of the US news cycle makes it clear that environmental stewardship is an important and relevant topic about which our neighbors (both locally and globally) care deeply. But it is also a topic regarding which the Church is largely paralyzed. This lecture will offer reasons for this situation within the Christian community and explore creation care from a biblical perspective.



Offering an overview of the biblical witness from Eden to the New Jerusalem, this lecture will investigate issues such as sustainable agriculture, humane animal husbandry, environmental terrorism, and the link between the "widow and the orphan" and degraded lands. The objective is to ask and answer the question, "Should a Christian be an Environmentalist?" via the Bible's witness of God's original and ongoing intentions for humanity's relationship with creation.

Our speaker, Dr. Sandra Richter, is internationally known for her work on Deuteronomy and the Deuteronomistic History and brings the Old Testament to life by exploring the real people and real places from which it comes. Learn more about her on the event page linked below.

Religious Freedom in a Secular Age

What does it mean to live in a "secular age?" Does such an age constitute a threat to religious freedoms? What is the difference between a secular age that protects freedom OF religion, and a secular age that would advocate a public square that is free FROM religion? Is secularism a threat to be fought, or is it a gift to Western society flowing from Christian tradition? Might it be both?



These questions will frame the address by Dr. Michael Bird, academic dean and lecturer in New Testament at Ridley College in Melbourne, Australia. He is the author of *Religious Freedom in a Secular Age* (Zondervan, 2022). As gospel-ministry practitioners parse out how to relate their churches and organizations to the public arena of the US, this will be a special opportunity to explore issues of gospel engagement that could set direction for years to come.

Weariness in ministry is not new to the Church. The writer of Hebrews admonishes God's people, "Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners so that you will not grow weary and lose heart" (Hebrews 12:3). Paul encourages the believers in Galatia to "not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." These passages acknowledge the challenge of living and ministering in a sinful and suffering world. Panelists will explore why there has been a trend in leaders leaving their ministries and discuss antidotes to help people address these challenges in healthy ways, leading to longevity in ministry.

Episode 101 | Caring for Those Experiencing an Unplanned Pregnancy




Episode 100 | Christian Nationalism




Fire in the Streets: How You Can Confidently Respond to Incendiary Cultural Topics
