Global Students




Global Students are welcome to find their own placements.

Although the Seminary only posts open positions local to the Denver metro area, this does not disqualify Global Students from participation in the Ministry Residency Program. Global Students are simply responsible for finding their own placements.

Follow the steps below to create your own Ministry Residency opportunity and take advantage of the benefits of gaining tuition assistance alongside hands-on ministry experience.

Creating a Ministry Residency position:

- 1. Student finds and connects with a local ministry about participation
- 2. Ministry contacts Jessica Schroeder to discern fit for the program and consider Residency details (jessica.schroeder@denverseminary.edu or 303.357.5883)
- 3. Ministry creates a Residency job description and sends to Jessica Schroeder for approval
- 4. Student and ministry fill out and submit pledge form (w/ Terms & Conditions) each semester
- 5. Ministry pays pledged amount to Denver Seminary by payment deadline



Answers to FAQs:

• How much should ministries pledge?

We recommend \$4,000 per semester for 8-12 hours of work. Positions requiring more hours may increase their pledge amount and/or offer a taxable living stipend paid directly to the student.

- What paperwork is required?
 - In addition to crafting a Residency job description, one pledge form is required per semester per Resident. This includes the first page of signed Terms & Conditions as well.
- What if we miss the pledge form due date for the given semester?
 - Positions may begin at any time during the year. However, it is preferable for new Residencies to begin before the start of a new semester so students may factor this into their tuition payment. While most forms of payment are refundable, students should verify with the Business Office regarding any previous tuition payments if starting a Residency after the payment deadline.
- How long do Residency positions last?
 - The pledge forms are completed on a semester-by-semester basis (fall, spring, summer), and the length may be as long as the ministry and student mutually agree upon, up to the length of the student's time of enrollment at the Seminary.
