A MESSAGE FROM The president

This is the fifteenth time I've written the introductory letter to our annual report. And it's my last. At the end of 2024 I'm retiring from my very full-time role as President of Denver Seminary to take on a part-time role as Chancellor.

Strong institutions not only survive leadership transitions but often thrive through them. Denver Seminary is a strong institution. We are built on a foundation established nearly seventy-five years ago—a foundation that has equipped us to face the challenges ahead.

Educationally, we are making our programs more accessible to more students. As a result of *Project Any*, students will be able to complete all of our programs either fully online, fully in-person, or through a combination of the two. And we've created a financial model that gives the Seminary greater resilience through difficult times as well as the resources to step into new opportunities to expand our mission. Our endowment has grown to over fifty million dollars, an amount that none of us ever dreamed possible when I began my tenure in 2009. Organizationally, we have outstanding governance through our Board of Trustees and effective leadership through our administration. Our faculty brings academic excellence, life wisdom, and a passion for learning into every classroom. **Bottom line: Denver Seminary is well positioned to grow in the years ahead!**

I've been a theological educator for over forty-three years. And I still believe in theological education. In fact, now more than ever, I believe that for the Church to thrive in our increasingly complex, even confounding world, we need theologically astute, hermeneutically responsible, and missionally passionate men and women to lead. That kind of leadership only comes through the kind of rigorous training that Denver Seminary offers.

In many ways these last fifteen years as President have created a capstone to my calling as a theological educator. When asked how I feel about retiring, my response is always the same, "grateful." Grateful for colleagues, mentors, friends, donors, alumni, students, and many others who have helped shape Denver Seminary through these last fifteen years. I pray that this report will encourage and inspire you. We have much to be thankful for and much to look forward to.

And through *Project Any*, Denver Seminary is making it possible for programs to be available to more men and women seeking theological training than ever before. The goal is to make it possible for students to complete any degree program fully on campus and fully online.

As we begin a new calendar year, the Board of Trustees is delighted to announce the hiring of Dr. Mark Husbands as Denver Seminary's eighth president. We believe God has divinely prepared Dr. Husbands for this season of our mission. His theological expertise, leadership proficiency, and business acumen will undergird his gifts in strategic innovation and team development. This line from Dr. Husbands' recent bio expresses his heart: "An abiding commitment to the Centrality of Christ, the truth and efficacy of God's Word, academic excellence, moral theology, and World Christianity has been central to Dr. Mark Husbands' leadership and work as a theologian."



Master's-Level Enrollment







Enrollment by Degree***





REVENUE & EXPENSES

As a percentage of total income, tuition and fees represents 29%. Keeping this percentage down offers our students a more affordable education. Temporarily restricted contributions and investment income represent the largest segments of total income




ENDOWMENT GROWTH

THE SEMINARY OF THE FUTURE: DENVER SEMINARY'S CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

In 2025, Denver Seminary will enter the public phase of our \$23 million capital campaign, a bold endeavor that started in July 2023 and has already raised more than \$17.7 million in cash and commitments. This campaign is driven by a vision to position the Seminary for the future, focused on three core pillars: accessibility, affordability, and sustainability.

Pillar 1: Expanding Access through Project Any

At the heart of making Denver Seminary more accessible is *Project Any*, a transformative initiative aimed at making every degree program accessible from anywhere, anytime, to any qualified student. Imagine pursuing your seminary education from the comfort of your home, fully online, or in person on our beautiful campus.

Pillar 2: Making Seminary More Affordable through Scholarships

Affordability remains a key concern for students, and our goal is to ease the financial burden by offering strategic scholarships. These 50-percent tuition scholarships, renewable for up to three years, will significantly reduce student debt and make it easier for students to answer their call to ministry.

Pillar 3: Building a Sustainable Future with Endowed Faculty Chairs

To secure the future of our faculty and the Seminary's long-term sustainability, we are restructuring around fully endowed faculty chairs. These endowed positions will not only ensure top-tier teaching and scholarship but also save \$800,000 annually from our operating budget. This model allows us to expand online coursework through *Project Any* and fully engage our adjunct faculty, creating a robust and financially stable academic environment.
