

Celebrating the First Graduating Class of Our PhD in Counselor Education and Supervision Program

In a historic milestone for Denver Seminary, we proudly celebrate the first graduating class of the PhD in Counselor Education and Supervision program. Launched in 2021, this rigorous program was designed to develop counselor educators, supervisors, researchers, and leaders who will have a transformative impact on the field of counseling—and the world beyond.

This May, seven remarkable individuals will cross the stage, each having demonstrated extraordinary commitment, perseverance, and scholarly excellence. Their scholarly contributions and professional engagement have already made a lasting impact—not only through their research, but also through their vital role in helping us submit our CACREP self-study, a significant step toward achieving program accreditation and advancing the future of counselor education at Denver Seminary.

The dissertation work of this inaugural class reflects a profound engagement with some of the most pressing and complex issues facing individuals and communities today. Their dissertation titles include:

- *"Shooting Arrows into the Abyss:" A Phenomenology of the Professional Cyclists Transition to Life After Sport*
- *Treating Eating Disorders in Women Survivors of Childhood Sexual Abuse - A Narrative Investigation*
- *The Relationship Between Strengths-Based Factors and Acculturative Strengths Among Christian Ukrainian Immigrant Adolescents*
- *Gender and Verbal Classroom Participation: The Effect of Personality, Gender Socialization, and Teaching Alliance on the Frequency and Duration of Verbal Student Engagement*
- *Music Performance Anxiety: An Exploration Through the Lens of Attachment and Trauma*
- *Wounded in the Sanctuary: The Impact of Spiritual Abuse on Mental Health in Western Populations*
- *Support or Not? A Phenomenological Study to Understand How Single, Never-Married Women Experience Support within the Evangelical Church in the Pacific Northwest*

These dissertations not only demonstrate academic excellence but also a deep commitment to addressing real-world issues with compassion, insight, and integrity.

Equipping the Church to Heal: Denver Seminary Launches Trauma-Informed Ministry Track





We live in a world where trauma is no longer the exception as it weaves through every layer of society, from families and congregations to institutions and communities. Ministry leaders today are increasingly called to serve in spaces shaped by suffering and unhealed wounds.

Recognizing this, Denver Seminary is launching a groundbreaking Trauma-Informed Ministry track within its [Doctor of Ministry \(DMin\) program](#), beginning in Fall 2025. The registration for this first cohort is September 15.

The world in which Christian ministers serve and lead is increasingly defined by trauma—personal, organizational, and systemic. In this 33-credit program, students will deepen their understanding of the nature and impact of trauma and will be equipped to offer courageous and compassionate trauma-informed care and leadership in their own ministry settings.

Students will explore the realities of trauma across diverse contexts and will study with experienced faculty and practitioners. Specialized courses include Understanding Trauma and Attachment, How People Grow, Leading Systems/Leading Change, The Practice of Trauma-Informed Ministry, and Soul Care in a Broken World.
